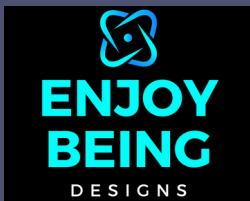

Space Planning and Layout

4. The Basics of Room Layout

Determine the Purpose of the Room

Begin by identifying the primary function(s) of the room. Is it a cozy living room for family gatherings or a multifunctional workspace for both adults and children?

Sketch Layouts Before Moving Furniture

Use graph paper or room layout software to sketch potential arrangements before heavy lifting. This helps visualize proportions and prevents the space from being overcrowded.

Maintain a Focal Point

Every room should have a strong visual anchor like a fireplace, large window, or TV. Arrange the furniture so that it directs attention to this focal point without obstructing traffic flow.

5. Traffic Flow & Functionality

Allow Enough Space for Movement

Make sure there's enough space between furniture pieces for people to walk around easily. A minimum clearance of 18 inches between the seating and the coffee table or side tables is a good rule.

Arrange Furniture to Facilitate Interaction

In conversation areas, position seating to face each other comfortably, allowing easy conversation without shouting.

Make Primary Furniture Pieces Easily Accessible

Ensure that the main seating areas, tables, and other critical furniture are conveniently accessible from all directions to improve practicality.

6. Understanding the Color Wheel

Basic Color Theory:

Layer Curtains for Depth:

Energy Efficiency:

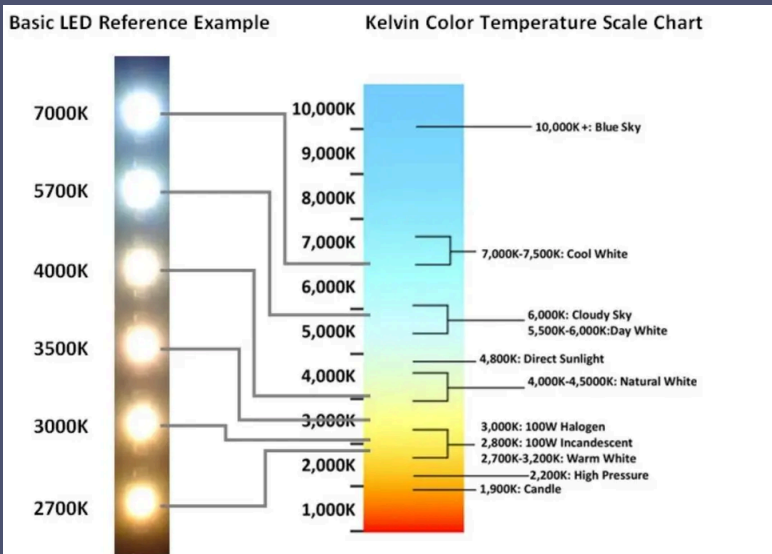
LEDs use less energy and last longer than traditional bulbs. They are ideal for eco-friendly homeowners.
